



## Extreme Weather

In the rare event of EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS [eg heavy snowfall] across the whole of the City, the Local Authority may take a central decision to close all schools.

Any such decision affecting all schools will be made by 6.45 am at the latest. This will then be announced through Heart FM, Radio WM and Free Radio, and will also be put on the City Council disruption web site and on Twitter service.

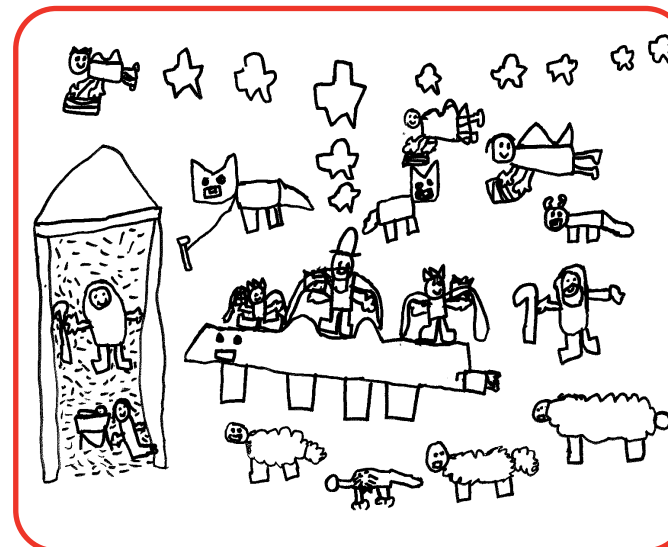

## Admissions September 2014

If you are applying under category 3 or 4 [Church categories], a Supplementary Information Form will also be required.

Transfer from Year 2 to Year 3 Preference Forms have been distributed to all parents/carers of the current Year Two children. Applications should be submitted by 2 December 2013.

## Illness and Infection

If your child is absent from school, please telephone the School Office before 9.00 am on the same day. If you know in advance that your child will be away, perhaps for an appointment, please inform the class teacher or the School Office.

If your child has been absent please make sure that they are well before returning, especially if the illness is infectious. **In the case of sickness or diarrhoea** please keep your child at home until they have been free of symptoms for at least **48 hours**. If your child is unwell whilst they are at school we will contact you and ask you to collect them.
