Home School Jotter

One of the ways we are keeping school safe is by limiting the adults in the building. This means it may be harder than usual to pass a message to your child's class teacher.

Your child will be bringing home a small notebook which you may use to write any messages your child's teacher may need to see. You can of course phone or email if you would prefer.



If you have written a message for the teacher in the home school jotter, could your child come into school carrying the jotter in their hand so that the teacher knows to look.

Reading Books

We will be sending reading books home with children in the next few days.

When your child's reading book is returned to school it will be quarantined for 48hrs before being given to another child.

Sibling Going Home Arrangements

There has apparently been some confusion over sibling going home arrangements with our staggered times.

The arrangement to drop off and collect older siblings at the same time as younger siblings was designed to support families with different drop off and collection times, but was not intended to be interpreted as something you "must" do.

If you are happy to stick to each child's designated times this is actually easier for us to manage in school! We will also be opening the double wooden gates at the bottom of the playground as a way into the playground from the field after dropping off junior or Year One children.

If you have any concerns over your child's learning, social difficulties or anxieties; if you are eligible for Pupil Premium funding or speak English as an additional language at home; or if you as a parent are feeling overwhelmed; please do get in touch with us at school.

Blended Learning

We have been making plans for "Blended Learning" so that we can offer education both at school and at home if necessary due to Covid-19. We are mindful that children of our age group cannot access a great deal of learning independently, and need the majority of their tasks to be practical.

We believe most children would find participating in online learning for long periods of time difficult, but listened to your feedback that you would like more contact with class teachers. Therefore our plan is:

- If your child is **ill** they will not need to complete work
- If your child is **isolating** or **quarantining** at home but the rest of their class is in school, we will email (or post if you do not have access to a printer) the work which the rest of the class is completing.
- If a whole class is isolating or if we enter a **local lockdown** where school is asked to close to all pupils except keyworkers and vulnerable children; then we will be providing a mixture of live online sessions and work set through our online platform BGFL 365.



If we do have to move to online teaching, we will be using **Microsoft Teams** for live content. All children have access to this through their **BGFL 365+** log in (which is attached to this newsletter.) This is also the way that children can access work set for them as well as use some simple age appropriate programs.

Please would you let the office know if you feel accessing this content through a PC laptop or smart device such as a phone or tablet will be difficult for your family.

Parents' Evening

Towards the end of September, we usually have a "meet the teacher" parents' evening and then have another meeting after half term. We feel that face to face meetings are so valuable so we have thought very hard about how we can manage these with covid precautions in place.

We have decided that we would need to reduce the number of adults in the building at any one time, and also allow time between appointments for cleaning. As this will mean the meetings will take longer than usual, and be spread over three evenings, we have decided to combine the two usual meetings into one ten minute appointment. Although we usually welcome children at our parents evening we will be asking that you arrange to be able to come **without children** this time.
