Arrangements for Parents' Evenings

This week we are starting our parents' evenings.

Please follow this guide to keep everyone as safe as possible.



DO NOT come to your appointment if you have any symptoms of Covid-19, or if you have had close contact with someone with a positive test in the last 14 days. If you need to isolate, we will arrange a telephone appointment on another day.



Please wear a face mask when inside the school building.



Sanitise your hands on entry to the building and following your appointment.



No more than two adults should come to the appointment.



Please do not bring any children (except babies under 12 months) with you. If you cannot arrange childcare we will arrange for a telephone appointment on another day instead.



Please arrive promptly at the time of your appointment. There will not be an opportunity to look at your child's books, so you do not need to come beforehand. If you are more than 5 minutes late for your appointment the teacher will be unable to see you and we will arrange for a telephone appointment at another time.



Once your 10 minute appointment is finished, please leave the site promptly. If you have more to discuss with your child's teacher, they will arrange a follow up telephone appointment.



Entrance is though the Office Foyer doors. The Heath Road South gate and Bunbury Road gates will both be open. You do not need to follow the one way system on this occasion, but please be respectful and allow plenty of room to let other parents pass.



Teachers will also be wearing face masks.



If you would prefer a telephone call to a face-to-face appointment, please let the school office know and we will arrange this for you.

All parents should have received a letter emailed out earlier this week to let you know about the closure of class RY and the Reception wraparound care bubble due to a confirmed positive test result. Unmanned Gates

Can we remind parents that we do not have staff positioned to watch the gate at the bottom of the playground. An unaccompanied child could potentially walk out of the playground and onto the busy Bunbury Road.

It is **your responsibility** to see that your child has come into school safely. We understand that the one way system is inconvenient, however it is in place to keep everyone safe. Please do not leave your child at the top of the steps on Heath Road South as you need to be sure they have entered the building.

We cannot allow parents to watch from the top of the steps as this will create groups of adults which we must avoid.

If you are having difficulty with the timings of the school day and sibling drop offs, please contact the school office and we will find an arrangement that keeps your child, yourself and other members of the school family safe.
