#### COVID-19

We currently have two bubbles isolating at home (1B and 2B). There is not a connection between the two individuals and it appears that the transmission has come from outside of school.

Last time we had a bubble close (RY), no-one from that bubble went on to have symptoms, so we feel confident that the measures in place in school are working effectively.

Can we remind all of our families to keep following the government advice to control the virus.

DO NOT send your child to school if they or anyone in your household have any of the symptoms of Covid-19 (coronavirus). These are:

- A high temperature
- A new continuous cough
- A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

If you have had contact with someone with a confirmed case of COVID, you must isolate for the full 14 days, even if you have had a negative test result.
