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	<p>Why do we have assembly (2weeks) Pupils should learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • assembly is a time to be together • the important part of assembly is an 'act of worship' • assembly is a time to learn more about God, ourselves and each other • prayer is an important part of assembly <p>assembly can take place in different places</p> <p>What makes a place special (3 weeks)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • that some people have places that are special to them; • that there are special buildings where some people go to think and learn about God • that some people feel close to God anywhere or in their own special places 		<p>Who am I, and where do I belong? (3 weeks) Pupils should learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • that every person is special and unique • that some people believe that God made them this way • how new babies are welcomed • that people belong together in different ways • that religious people have different ways of showing they 'belong' together • about special people in different religions (e.g. Jesus / Muhammad (pbuh) / Moses) 			<p>What can we learn from stories?
